

14. Triangle Lake/Pond Hill Road

The high density of summer camps surrounding Triangle and Crystal Lakes in the highlands east of Huntersland is indicative of the human trait to seek a retreat from the routine of city living.

The highway designated Pond Hill Road gets its name from another pair of small bodies of water near the other end of the road which constitute the center point of the E.N. Huyck Preserve which operates a Biological Field Station. Unlike the first pair of lakes, Myosotis Lake and Lincoln Pond have nearly pristine shore lines inhabited primarily by beaver, muskrat, turtles and lesser animals. A few buildings at Lincoln Pond and more at Myosotis Lake serve the scientists who carry out their scientific studies in the summertime.
