6. Boucks Falls These Falls are located on the lower part of Panther Creek one of the larger tributaries of the Schoharie. It has carved a deep gorge in the Hamilton Beds of shale and sandstone. On the south side of the Falls is the road which leads into the Charlotte River valley. It was along this road that a thousand troops led by Sir John Johnson consisting of British Regulars, Tory Neighbors (blue eyed Indians) and Iroquois Indians approached the valley during mid October 1780. They burned the homes, barns and crops of the settlers, scalped and killed the pioneer yeomen and left a trail of desolation.
