

7. Duanesburg

The small town of Duanesburg was founded by James Duane who owned a large acreage of and centered around his little settlement. It was located on the Western Turnpike one of the first major roads connecting Buffalo with Albany. Great quantities of farm produce were carried along this road and some of the many taverns built for the travelers still remain.

This town is the last place along the Long Path where provisions can be obtained until the hiker reaches the Mohawk River at Otterdam Junction.
