

30. Plotter Kill Falls

The upper falls of the Plotter Kill consists of three separate falls near the head of the stream. Not much water comes over it except in the Spring or after extended storms.

These falls and the lower reaches of the Plotter Kill are part of a County of Schenectady Preserve. A hiking trail follows the stream on the right hand side. During dry weather the stream bed can be followed. A mile or so below the high falls the stream plunges over a series of cascades. In most instances water persists in the pool at the base of each of these falls, the water passing underground through the larger stones and gravel in the stream bed.
