

7. Galway Village

Continuing to the Northeast the village of Galway is the last provisioning place for any miles. It is a pretty little village and has a number of fine houses as befits a major crossroads of the early post Revolution period. A considerable portion of the land in this region is said to have been doled out in lieu of monetary payment to the veterans of the Revolution.

Galway Lake west of the village is a favorite summering place.

The north-south road passing through Galway is called the Sacandaga Trail and connects Fish House, Sir William Johnson's 40 fishing lodge on what is now Greater Sacandaga Lake, with Scotia/Schenectady.
