43. Northville Village

This village was founded a few years after 1800 and at one time was the chief lumbering center of the region. It is a provisioning center for the lower Adirondacks and is the southern terminus of the Northville-Lake Placid foot trail which passes through the central part of the Adirondack Wilderness by way of Lakes Piseco and the West Canada Lakes.

It is the last place one can buy food and other items before reaching Bakers Mills north of the wilderness threaded by the Long Path corridor stretching from Northville to Crane Mountain.

A military road once could be followed from just north of the village westward to the Windfall near the East Branch of the Sacandaga River north of Wells to the West Canada Lakes Country and Raquette Lake.
