57. Bakers Mills Village The tiny hamlet of Bakers Mills is the next Landmark on the Path. A small country store may provide provisions to sustain the liker since it may be two days before the excellent stores of North Creek are reached. This place was a lumbering town and had oth a sawmill and a grist mill during its lory days. These both were located below the iam of the Baker's Pond which provided the ills with the necessary water power. The ond once had some of the finest trout fishing to be had in the region. Huge, native, speckled brook trout frequented the spring toles which fed the pond. Only a beaver pond exists there now. Mossy brook, a stream oming down from Edwards Hill, originates in veveral large, cold springs.
