

57. Bakers Mills Village

The tiny hamlet of Bakers Mills is the next Landmark on the Path. A small country store may provide provisions to sustain the hiker since it may be two days before the excellent stores of North Creek are reached.

This place was a lumbering town and had both a sawmill and a grist mill during its glory days. These both were located below the dam of the Baker's Pond which provided the mills with the necessary water power. The pond once had some of the finest trout fishing to be had in the region. Huge, native, speckled brook trout frequented the spring holes which fed the pond. Only a beaver pond exists there now. Mossy brook, a stream coming down from Edwards Hill, originates in several large, cold springs.
