

65. Boreas River

The Boreas River is west of the mouth of Deer Creek and downstream of the Blue Ledge on the Hudson. It flows into the Hudson close to the bridge carrying the rails of the Tahawus spur of the Delaware and Hudson Railroad which originally ended at North Creek.

The spur is no longer in active use with the shut down of the iron mines at Tahawus.

The Boreas is a beautiful river flowing out of Elk Lake one of the finest and most picturesque of the small lakes in the Adirondacks. It passes through a section of wild country but is crossed by the road to the Northwoods Club which leaves the North Creek - Newcomb Road from the upper part of Minerva Hill.
