66. Blue Ledge This is a steep cliff on the north side of the Hudson River which has much crystalline limestone in its structure. It is a famous place among the white water rafters since during the Spring runoff there are a considerable mass of rapids that continue along the Hudson after the precipitous drop along the lower Indian River. An old trail leads from west of the Blue Ledge to a trail head east of Huntley Pond. It traverses State Land and climbs from River level to the higher land east of the boundary of the Northwoods Club where Winslow Homer produced some of his fine paintings.
