

67. Hot Water Pond Cavern

This is a fairly extensive cavern extending from near the edge of Hot Water Pond (probably named for its shallow sun heated waters). Its outlet plunges into a conical sink hole which stream appears again on a wooded hillside above the Boreas River. The Delaware and Hudson Railroad had a spur line which started in the village of North Creek, ran up the west side of the Hudson to the Boreas River mouth. The rails crossed the Hudson at this place and followed the western side of the Boreas River crossing the Northwood Club's Road and continuing past the outlet of Hot Water Pond and northward to the State Road crossing. Newcomb, the next landmark, is reached from this State Road to the road leading into the Moose Pond Club.
