73. Indian Pass and Wallface Mountain This is one of the most spectacular sites in the Adirondacks. The illumination of the vertical 1200 foot cliff of Wallface Mountain illuminated by the light of the full moon is a sight never to be forgotten. It is strongly recommended that the hiker arrange the trip to reach Indian Pass on the date of the Full Moon. A campsite can be found on the east side of Indian Pass which provides an uninterrupted view of the Wallface Cliff on the night of the Full Moon. During the day the massive agglomeration of huge angular blocks which have fallen from the mountain form ice "caves" where trapped Wallface snow is slowly converted to pristine ice in 100_Mtn the lowest crevices.
