

Horicon Historic Markers

1. *House 1840*

On Church St in Adirondack, close to its intersection with Red Wing Rd. Built in 1840, this structure is the oldest house in Horicon. It was once owned by Edwin Bush, who was the Superintendent of a big tannery in the hamlet of Adirondack. At the tannery, hides were tanned into leather using the bark of Hemlock trees. The house is still standing and is privately owned.

2. *Horicon Grist Mill*

On State Route 8 in Brant Lake, across from Market St and Mill Pond. This site was once a grist mill built in 1865 by Jud Barton. It was operated by he and his sons until 1937 and was powered by water from the outlet of Mill Pond.

3. *Heintzelman Library*

On State Route 8 in Brant Lake, on the south side of Mill Pond, across from the Brant Lake Town Hall. This stone and wood building was built in 1907 and housed the Horicon Library. Some years later, the Town of

Horicon assumed responsibility of the building. After the new Horicon Free Library was built in 2001, this building became the office of the town historian as well as home to historic archives of the town.
