

Warren County doctors urge – Get Vaccinated!

When we get sick or have a medical question, we turn to our doctors and nurses. We trust them with our lives, and those of our loved ones, in trying times.

The worst pandemic in a century is one of those trying times.

COVID vaccines are helping us emerge from that pandemic. Nearly 6 months have passed from when the first vaccines were administered in Warren County, and more than 32,800 county residents have been fully vaccinated. Only 14 of those vaccinated residents have been diagnosed with COVID since!

We still need thousands of Warren County residents to do their part, however.

Our doctors were among the first who were offered COVID vaccines, and the overwhelming majority here in Warren County got their shot as soon as they could last December and January.

A number of them came forward in recent days with messages of support for these vaccines, and <u>requested that their patients get vaccinated as soon as they can.</u>

"Our medical providers aren't just saying that we should get vaccinated. They did it themselves, and also encouraged their loved ones to get vaccinated," said **Ginelle Jones, Director of Warren County Health Services**. "They understand the science and medicine behind these vaccines, and were eager to get the shot because they knew that it is the best weapon we have to help bring this health emergency under control."

Here is what Warren County's physicians and nurses had to say about COVID vaccination:

- "With the summer months just around the corner and everyone hoping for a return to 'normal' now is the time to get your COVID-19 vaccine. Consider the fact that well over 80% of your friends and neighbors who work at Glens Falls Hospital have received both of their shots; that should give you confidence that the health care professionals who live and work in your community trust that the vaccines available are safe and effective. And there are some startling statistics with regard to those who contract COVID-19 and survive COVID-19 survivors have an almost 60% greater chance of death within 6 months compared to the general population.
