

Chester Cemeteries to Explore

1. *Baroudi Family*

On Bird Pond Rd, about .30 miles from the intersection with Owens Rd, visible from the road.

2. *Igerna*

At the intersection of Igerna Rd and Bird Pond Rd, visible from the road.

3. *Fish*

On Perry Rd, near 52 Perry Rd, visible from the road.

4. *Fish Hollow*

Off Fish Hollow Rd, on private property, not visible from the road, not accessible.

On Friends Lake Rd, at the intersection with Knapp Hill Rd, visible from the road.

8. *West Church*

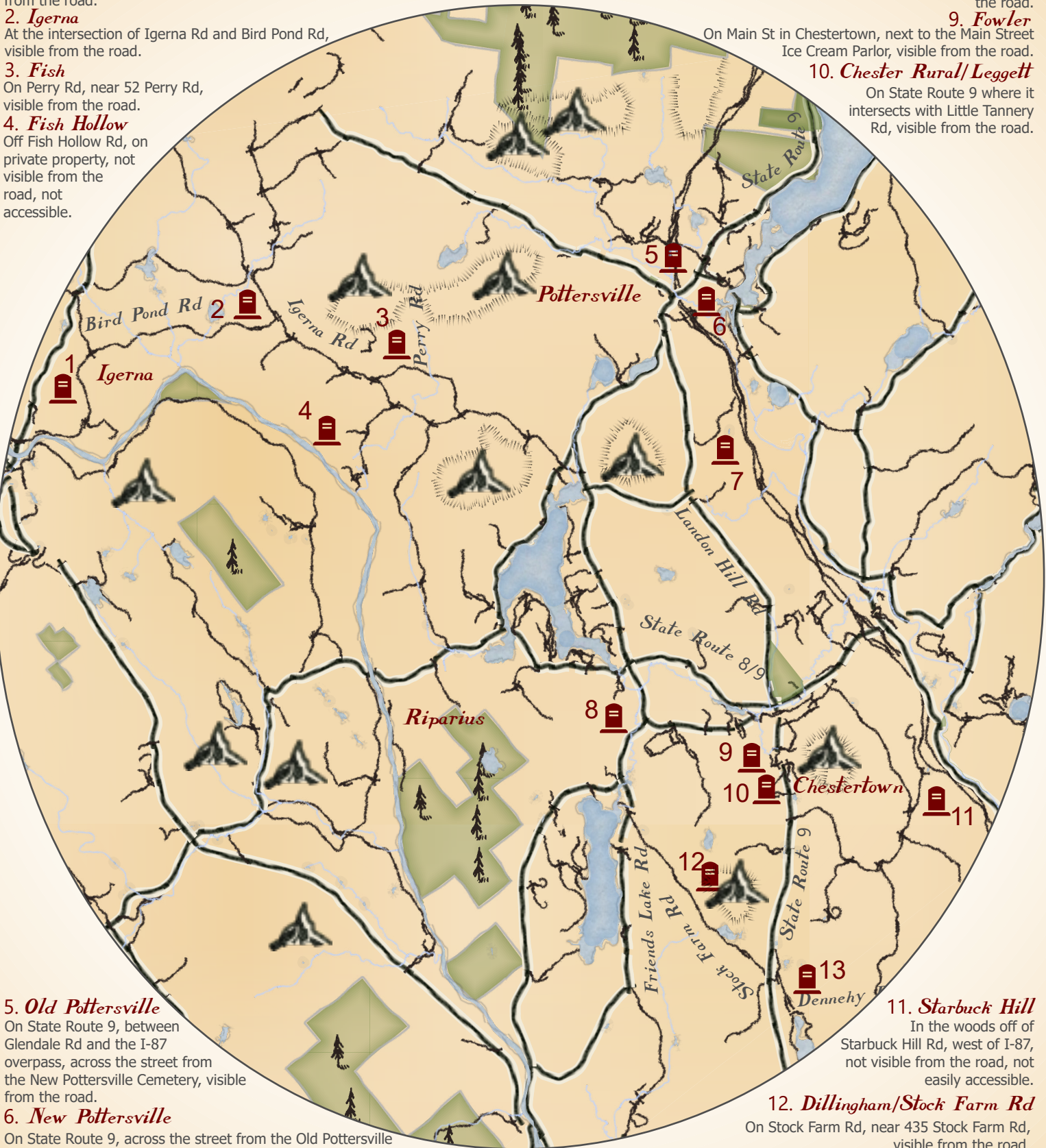
On Main St in Chestertown, next to the Main Street Ice Cream Parlor, visible from the road.

9. *Fowler*

On State Route 9 where it intersects with Little Tannery Rd, visible from the road.

10. *Chester Rural/Leggett*

On State Route 9 where it intersects with Little Tannery Rd, visible from the road.



5. *Old Pottersville*

On State Route 9, between Glendale Rd and the I-87 overpass, across the street from the New Pottersville Cemetery, visible from the road.

6. *New Pottersville*

On State Route 9, across the street from the Old Pottersville Cemetery, next to Christ Church, visible from the road.

7. *Landon Hill*

On Ingraham Rd, about 1/4 of a mile from its intersection with Landon Hill Rd, visible from the road.

At the end of Dennehy Rd, about 1/4 of a mile from its intersection with State Route 9, visible from the road.

11. *Starbuck Hill*

In the woods off of Starbuck Hill Rd, west of I-87, not visible from the road, not easily accessible.

12. *Dillingham/Stock Farm Rd*

On Stock Farm Rd, near 435 Stock Farm Rd, visible from the road.

13. *Darrowsville*

At the end of Dennehy Rd, about 1/4 of a mile from its intersection with State Route 9, visible from the road.

Chester Historic Markers

1. *United Methodist Church*

On State Route 9 in Pottersville, between the intersections with Olmstedville Rd and Valley Farm Rd. The year 1810 was the beginning of organized Methodism in Pottersville. In 1835, a Sunday School was organized and in 1847 a church building was constructed. That building has been enlarged and renovated over the years and is still in use today.

2. *Fowler House*

On Main St in Chestertown, between the bank and Church of the Good Shepherd. The Fowler House was built in the early 1800s. Charles Fowler was a Chestertown merchant. His sons, Byron and Joseph were prominent Glens Falls businessmen. The three buildings of the Historic District were part of the property once owned by Fowler. It is now the Chester Inn, owned by the Robbins family and rented out to visitors.

3. *Church of the Good Shepherd*

On Main St between the Chester Inn and the Main Street Ice Cream Parlor.

The Church of the Good Shepherd was organized in 1876 and the Church itself was built in 1883. Under the leadership of Reverend Clement Whipple. It was consecrated in 1884, and the new parish hall was added in 1954 after the former Parish was sold.

4. *Chester Town Hall*

On Main St across from the grocery store. This was originally known as the home of the Chestertown Central School, which opened in 1935. When the North Warren Central School District was formed, the building became the North Warren Central School. In 1999, a new North Warren Central School building was erected and the former Chestertown Central School became the Town of Chester Municipal Center in 2001.

5. *Chester War Memorial*

In front of the Town of Chester Municipal Center. The plaque is dedicated to those men and women who served the country in a time of need in all wars and conflicts.

6. *Darrowville Memorial*

On Dennehy Rd, about 3 miles south of Chestertown. The Memorial was built upon the footprint of the Darrowville Wesleyan Methodist Church. The Church was built in about 1845 and was deconstructed in 2011. The Church was a stop of the Underground Railroad.
