

Take a short cruise on the Minne-Ha-Ha, one of the last steam paddle wheel ships in America, or take a trip down the full length of the lake on the Mohican, the oldest continuously operated tour boat in America and listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Or check out the splendid Adirondac, the newest ship on the lake, modeled after late 19th-century touring ships.

Experience History

The Native Americans called this lake Andia-ta-roc-te and it served as an important transportation route for both the natives and the Europeans who discovered the lake in the 17th century. During the French and Indian War, Lake George served a critical role in the fight for control of the area between the French and British. The Battle of Lake George was one of the first major victories of the British against the French. Or spend a beautiful fall weekend enjoying Jazz at the Lake, a 35 year tradition combining spectacular jazz with the magical beauty of Lake George.



Soak it Up

Lake George's iconic beaches beckon swimmers and sunbathers of all ages. The famous Million Dollar Beach can accommodate hundreds of beachgoers and features new facilities and jaw-dropping views to the north. Shepard Park Beach sits just off Canada Street in the Village. Usher Park Beach on the east side of the lake is a family-centric beach and park with a sloping lawn perfect for picnicking.
