Brant Lake

Brant Lake is a hidden treasure, situated a bit off the beaten path. The picturesque Mill Pond at the southern end of the lake is the perfect spot for a stroll, picnic or swim at the beach and a great location to launch your canoe or kayak for a paddle to the open waters of beautiful Brant Lake. The pace may be a little slower sometimes, but doesn't that sound like just what you're looking for?

Winter Carnival

Have a frozen blast on the ice at the Brant Lake Winter Carnival! This annual snow party, held in February, features wild wintertime activities like outhouse races, the fry pan toss, a broomball tournament, dog sled rides, and more. Live music, great food, and a fireworks show make this a can't miss winter event.



Paddle On!

Tucked between Schroon Lake and Lake George, Horicon has wild land in every direction and more lakes and ponds than any other town in the County, making it the perfect spot to paddle. Launch your canoe or kayak on the Mill Pond, onto the Schroon River, Schroon Lake, Brant Lake, or hike in to Lily Pond, Island Pond or Round Pond, where you may have the water all to yourself.



Get Hooked

Brant Lake has over 15 miles of shoreline and a town boat launching facility. Bass anglers enjoy a solid largemouth bass population and the lake is stocked annually with brown and rainbow trout. Nearby, the southern end of Schroon Lake is host to a state boat launch. Schroon Lake is both a warm and cold water fishery that features bass, lake trout and salmon, among other species.



Go Off-Road

Brant Lake Bike Park offers a professionally designed 207 acre course with six miles of single-track trails under a canopy of towering pines. Situated directly behind The Hub, a longtime cycling-enthusiast oasis, this mountain biking network hugging Bartonville Mountain allows for intense climbs, remarkable views and thrilling descents.
