Let it Snow!

Bring your sled to Lake Luzerne, home to the South Warren Snowmobile Club, which meticulously maintains over 85 miles of corridor and secondary trails in Lake Luzerne and its adjoining communities. Enjoy our forest trails by snowshoe or on cross-country skis, or try your hand at ice fishing on one of our local lakes.



Adirondack Folk School

Climb into the oversized Adirondack chair at the entrance to the Adirondack Folk School; it makes the perfect group picture. The Folk School is open year round for the joy of hands-on learning the arts, crafts, and customs of the Adirondacks. Learn to fly fish, weave on a loom, create a pack basket, build a canoe or toboggan, or hammer hot iron and steel in the blacksmith shop, with some of the best Adirondack instructors.

Harris Preserve

Set off in search of escape at the 112 acre preserve on Potash Mountain. The beautiful wooded area is used for forest-based education and yearlong recreation. At a modest 1752' elevation, its classic, rugged profile provides an outdoor adventurer's paradise, with beautiful views of Fourth Lake, Stewart Brook, the Thomas Mountain Range, and the Hudson River. On crisp, clear days, catch a glimpse of the High Peaks off to the north. The reward is well worth your effort!
