

Ith its handsome Victorian-era homes on tree-lined streets, Warrensburg has over 400 residential, commercial, civic, industrial and religious properties on the National and State Historic Registers within its Hamlet Historic District. Four walking tours, two driving tours and the Discover Warrensburgh! Museum of Local History help visitors explore Warrensburg's fascinating past as a center for lumber, leather tanning, and textile production.

A Walk in the Park

This small town between two rivers offers a plethora of recreational experiences, with fifteen parks, numerous trails, and several canoe, kayak and fishing access points along both the Schroon and Hudson rivers. Explore the town's history at the Historic Mills District Park, swim at Morry Stein Park and Beach, enjoy river views from the town's many pocket parks, or enjoy the numerous recreation fields, toboggan run, and extensive playground at the Warrensburg Recreational Field.

Climb Hackensack Mountain for a stunning view of the hamlet, or play 18 holes of golf along the Hudson River.



The World's Largest Garage Sale, a lively combination of a flea market, craft fair, food fest, and bargain hunter's dream, happens annually on the weekend before Columbus Day weekend. An entire community of vendors and local garage sales gather on the main drag and residential backstreets to sell items of all types. As they say at the World's Largest Garage Sale, "if you can't find it here, it doesn't exist!"



MillAround

Warrensburg lies beside the Schroon River where it flows into the lively upper reaches of the Hudson. Waterpower from the river drove early mills that formed the core of a bustling 19th-century town. The rumble of millstones and screech of saws are quiet now, so visitors and residents can fish, kayak, canoe or tube on rapids or calm waters.



Enjoy live band concerts every summer Wednesday evening at the town's historic bandstand. Celebrate the long-running Smoke Eaters Jamboree in July, with a carnival, booming fireworks, delicious food, and live music sponsored by the Warrensburg Volunteer Fire Company.
