Abolishing Activity Director Position – Tabled from June BOS meeting- request to abolish this position effective July 31, 2009.

As staff at Countryside pointed out we are required to have 10 hours of scheduled activities including nights and weekends with the downsizing we would still provide that but we only need an individual to specifically cover those 10 hours which does not require an Activity Director we can instead utilize a Leisure Time Activity Aid. (see below for Resolution Request)

Abolishing the Case Manager Position was tabled waiting written confirmation of the approved downsizing to the facility by Department of Health, we now have written confirmation and a copy has been attached therefore I am requesting that approval now be given to abolish this position. I am requesting that we push for approval to abolish this position 30 days from the last BOS meeting which would be July 20th.

* I would like to go to Executive session to discuss the performance of a specific staff member and the reasons for the request to be pushed through before the next BOS meeting.

New Business:

Resolution request to create a Leisure Time Activity Aide Grade 3 at a base salary of \$9,500.00

Rational: as stated previously Countryside does not need a full-time Activity department we are only required to provide 10 hours per week of “scheduled “ activities including nights and weekends. (Please see attached Letter of Thought and the resolution request).

Resolution Request to: Attend a Seminar Infectious Diseases

Rational: This will provide 6.3 CEU’s of my required 60 every 2 years

Request to : Attend a Seminar – Motivational Interviewing

Rational This provides another 6.3 CEU’s towards the required 60 over a two year period.

Dr. Barry M. Gregory, Ed.D, M.Ed, LMHC, NCC is the Executive Director of the National Addictions Training Institute. He maintains a national training, consulting and an online counseling practice in Boca Raton and Boynton Beach, Florida. He has extensive research and clinical experience with MI and CBT with college students with alcohol and other drug problems and dual-diagnosed homeless populations. His doctoral dissertation (Gregory, 2001) was one of the first published studies on the efficacy of brief motivational and skills-building intervention with female student athletes. He has conducted over 300 national training seminars on suicide, ethics, bipolar disorder, addictions, college binge drinking, motivational interviewing, cognitive-behavioral therapies, and co-occurring disorders. He has presented his research findings at national conferences, served as a faculty member, assistant director and associate dean in higher education, consulted with colleges and universities, published white papers, authored two treatment manuals, and served on community coalitions. Dr. Gregory has also appeared on local health-focused radio programs and MSNBC for a one hour documentary on college binge drinking. Finally, he has developed a not-for-profit web site designed to provide consumers and professionals with easy access to information and resources on mental health and cognitive-behavioral therapies.
