



This training will specialize in investigations involving the sexual abuse and exploitation of high-risk/chronic runaways, the victimization of children through prostitution and cases involving children who have had repeated reports of victimization. Additionally, this training will provide participants with the skills to proactively identify cases with children who have repeat/multiple runaways in order to identify current or past victimization using case studies and practical application. A panel discussion featuring key agencies working within the criminal justice system and providing services to high risk victims will address participant's questions and how this training can apply to local communities. Opening speakers will also discuss the updates and differences between the NYS and Federal Human Trafficking laws and victim rights and services both at a state and federal level.

In 2000, Agent Roslyn came to the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco Firearms as a Special Agent in Burlington, Vermont where he worked until 2005. He was promoted to Resident Agent in Charge of the AFT, Hartford Connecticut Violent Crime Impact Team where he supervised a specialized team of ATF Agents. Agent Mostyn is an interviewing techniques instructor for the ATF at their national academy as well as the Project Safe Neighborhoods program, teaching interviewing and deception techniques to federal, state and local law enforcement officers across the United States, Caribbean, and Caribbean. Agent Mostyn is currently assigned as the Resident Agent in Charge of the Burlington, Vermont Field Office.
