



SUMMER

THE SEASON OF BLISS







THE SEASON OF SPLENDOR



Like magic, six million acres of mountainsides, rolling hills, and forests transform into a colorful palette of brilliant gold, vermilion, orange and purple when autumn falls upon the region. Go forest bathing in a glade of golden-leaved birch trees, paddle a canoe route and capture the stunning light of the reflected landscape, or take a motorcycle ride to a mountain summit to photograph the meeting of fall colors and winter's first frost.

Don't Miss: Stargazing at the Adirondack Sky Center and Observatory, Adirondack Balloon Festival, Lowville Cream Cheese Festival, Saranac Lakes Chain, War of 1812/Battle of Plattsburgh Weekend, mountain biking maintained trails.





WINTER

THE SEASON OF WONDER



When the temperature drops, the Adirondacks come alive, as hiking trails become ski trails, nature paths become cross-country skiing and snowshoe routes, and lakes freeze up for ice fishing and ice skating. Enjoy an alpenglow sunset from a cozy cabin with a private view of snow-capped mountains – and a Jacuzzi tub perfect for après ski relaxing. Explore a castle made of ice, go dog sledding, or simply revel in the merriment during an Adirondack winter carnival. Fall in love with winter in the Adirondacks!

Don't Miss: Gore, Oak, Pisgah, Snow Ridge, Titus, West, & Whiteface mountains; Saranac Lake & Lake George winter carnivals, Ausable Chasm, High Falls Gorge.
