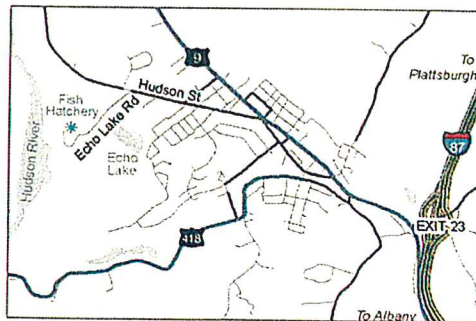


Dear Sir/Madam,

This letter is written in appreciation of the extraordinary assistance those at the Warren County Fish Hatchery, particularly Manager Jeff Inglee, provided our Chapter of Trout Unlimited in carrying out our support of numerous area Trout in the Classroom programs this past Fall. This program is implemented by teachers in local schools, including schools in Warrensburg, Queensbury, Lake George and Glens Falls, and entails raising trout eggs in the classroom for eventual placement in area streams. The program is widely praised for the environmental education benefits it provides as well as for its inculcating a sense of environmental stewardship in our youth. We are sure you share these same goals.

This past Fall Jeff Inglee committed to providing fertilized brook trout eggs to teachers in the program who preferred to raise our native species of trout. A number of them signed up. However, due to a catastrophic event at the New York State Hatchery that supplied the eggs, none were able to be made available, thus endangering the ability of those who had signed up to carry out their programs this academic year. Jeff was resolute in attempting to find another source to timely fulfill our need for eggs. When all efforts appeared to be in vain he was successful in stripping eggs from older fish at the hatchery and fulfilling his commitment.

Please be aware too, that our organization continues to support and promote the Hatchery's Spring Zing day. We believe such events also significantly promote and encourage environmental awareness--- particularly with respect to the need to preserve and protect the cold water streams that are vital to insuring that future generations can experience the pleasures provided by access to the water resources that are one of Warren County's premier attractions.

For Jeff and his staff's "beyond the call of duty" efforts, we gratefully extend our thanks and also wish to thank the Board of Supervisors for their continued support of their efforts.

RFP Decision-making Process

1. Committee: County Administrator provides general overview and presentation of all proposals received.
2. Committee: Staff provides a more specialized analysis of written proposals.
3. Committee: Interview proposers, rank proposals, and establish negotiation parameters.
4. Committee Chair: Appoint Negotiating Team.
5. Negotiating Team: Negotiate with proposer(s) and report back to Committee.
6. Committee: Decide appropriate course of action.
7. Board of Supervisors: Final approval.
