* Note: Above please find the financials YTD as of 2/11/2021. We are in the process of closing January 2021 for the CHHA Program. Totals above due also include expenses related to COVID 19 activities.

For 2020, we still need to reflect revenues for Grants and State Aid along with also reflecting the WIC Food voucher values in both Revenues and Expenses. Year to date the total COVID-19 expenses were \$169,476.58 of which \$138,007.84 or 81.43% are related to Salaries and related fringe for Contact Tracing and quarantined home visits. We have three grants from the State that will assist in reimbursing the County for these expenses. These revenues will also be reflected in 2020 once all has been summarized.

Overall, total salaries are \$18,358.04 or 7.36% over 2020 Salaries. Regular salaries are under 2020 due primarily to positions that remain open in both the CHHA and WIC programs. Part time Salaries are over due to the Public Health Assistants that were hired to assist in COVID tracking. Overtime Salaries is also over primarily related to time spent in COVID-19 duties and Overtime related to COVID Immunization Clinics. Salaries related to COVID activities are Part time salaries of \$38,171 or 71.20% of the total Part time salary expense and \$18,292 or 53.22% is in Overtime. Overtime related directly to COVID Clinics is \$4,562. Salaries are currently 8.12% of the budget while last year was 8.88% of budget.

Comments:

Salaries: (please see previous page) overall are \$18,358.04 or 7.36% above 2020 as of 2/11/21. Salaries for 2021 are 8.12% of the budget YTD. As stated, due to COVID activities, Per Diem and Part Time staff are now being utilized in the Public Health Department as COVID clinics have started as of the first of the year. To also note, both the Overtime and Part time categories reflect the the Public Health hours paid for COVID related activities which total \$58,786.55 year to date or 66.82% of the total Overtime and Part time salaries. This includes all Contact Tracers, Staff for COVID clinics, and additional staff hours needed to cover daily COVID related activities.

Equipment: This year we needed to purchase some additional phone equipment.

Contractual Expenses: These are slightly lower than 2020 due to timing of invoices.

Employee Benefits: Employee benefits are under 2020 due to savings in salaries within programs.

Revenues: Revenues for 2021 do not yet reflect the January CHHA billings. Due to COVID activities, there are no clinics being held for Rabies and other Immunizations or Travel clinic, therefore no revenues at this time. Revenues for 2020 are reflecting an accrual that was a reversal from 2019. At this time it is too early to provide much in Revenues for 2021.
