Ms. Braymer called the meeting of the Proposed Septic Inspection at Transfer Committee to order at 1:21 p.m.

Copies of the meeting Agenda were distributed to the Committee members and a copy of same is on file with the meeting minutes.

A discussion ensued regarding the proposed Septic Inspection at Transfer Law included in the agenda packet during which the consensus of the Committee was to develop a law that would require inspections when properties were sold and to include the stipulation that inspections would be required every five years following the sale. It was also noted that education was key to ensuring homeowners were aware of how imperative it was to perform the required maintenance and/or upkeep on their septic systems to prevent contamination in the local waterways.

As there was no further business to come before the Septic Inspection at Transfer Law Committee, on motion made by Mr. Bruno and seconded by Mr. Magowan and carried unanimously, Ms. Braymer adjourned the meeting at 2:12 p.m.
