RESOLUTION NO. 108 OF 2022

RESOLUTION INTRODUCED BY SUPERVISORS LEGGETT, THOMAS, BRUNO, MERLINO, RUNYON, DIAMOND AND DRISCOLL

AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 442 OF 2020, ALLOCATING FUNDING EARMARKED FOR COMBATING AQUATIC INVASIVE SPECIES IN PUBLICLY ACCESSIBLE WATER BODIES IN WARREN COUNTY OTHER THAN LAKE GEORGE AND AUTHORIZING INTERMUNICIPAL AGREEMENTS FOR THE YEAR 2021, TO ALLOW FUNDING FOR THE TOWN OF LAKE LUZERNE TO BE CARRIED OVER INTO 2022

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 442 of 2020, Warren County authorized agreements with certain Towns, one specifically being the Town of Lake Luzerne, to combat aquatic invasive species in publicly accessible water bodies for 2021, in an amount not to exceed Forty-One Thousand Six Hundred Sixty-Six Dollars and Sixty-Six Cents (\$41,666.66), and

WHEREAS, the Supervisor of Lake Luzerne advised the Finance Committee that the funds allocated for 2021, in the amount of Forty-One Thousand Six Hundred Sixty-Six Dollars and Sixty-Six Cents (\$41,666.66), were unused and required to be returned to the County at the end of 2021, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Lake Luzerne during 2022 seeks to combat aquatic evasive species in publicly accessible bodies to include unperformed work in 2021 and planned work in 2022, and requests the funds to be carried over into 2022, and

WHEREAS, the Finance Committee approved the request to carry over the unused funds from 2021 into 2022, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Warren County Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Chair of the Board of Supervisors to execute an amendment agreement with the Town of Lake Luzerne indicating that the funds allocated to the Town for 2021, in the amount of Forty-One Thousand Six Hundred Sixty-Six Dollars and Sixty-Six Cents (\$41,666.66), will be carried over into 2022, and be it further

RESOLVED, that other than the changes outlined herein, all other terms and conditions of Resolution No. 442 of 2020 will remain the same.
