RESOLUTION INTRODUCED BY SUPERVISORS FRASIER, MCDEVITT, HOGAN, BRAYMER, CONOVER, BEATY AND GERACI

AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 356 OF 2017, AUTHORIZING AN AGREEMENT WITH ADIRONDACK COMMUNITY ACTION PROGRAM OF ESSEX COUNTY TO PROVIDE HOME DELIVERED MEALS TO HAGUE RESIDENTS, TO INCREASE THE COST OF HOME DELIVERED MEALS FOR OFFICE FOR THE AGING

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 194 of 2012, the Warren County Board of Supervisors authorized an agreement with Adirondack Community Action Program of Essex County to provide home delivered meals to residents in the Town of Hague for an amount of Two Dollars and Thirty Cents (\$2.30) per meal for a term commencing on April 1, 2012 and terminating on March 31, 2013, continuing annually unless there was a material change in the contract terms or provisions, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 356 of 2017, Warren County authorized an amendment agreement to increase the rate from Two Dollars and Thirty Cents (\$2.30) per meal to Seven Dollars and Fifty-Two Cents (\$7.52) per meal, and

WHEREAS, the Health Services Committee has approved a request to increase the rate from Seven Dollars and Fifty-Two Cents (\$7.52) per meal to Ten Dollars and Thirty-Three Cents (\$10.33) per meal, for a total amount not to exceed Twelve Thousand Dollars (\$12,000), for a term commencing April 1, 2022 and terminating March 31, 2023, and continuing annually unless there is a material change in the contract terms or provisions, now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Warren County Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Chair of the Board to execute an amendment agreement with Adirondack Community Action Program of Essex County to increase the rate for home delivered meals to residents in the Town of Hague to Ten Dollars and Thirty Three Cents (\$10.33) per meal, for a total amount not to exceed Twelve Thousand Dollars (\$12,000), for a term commencing April 1, 2022 and terminating March 31, 2023, and continuing annually unless there is a material change in the contract terms or provisions, in a form approved by the County Attorney, and be it further

RESOLVED, that other than the changes outlined herein, all other terms and conditions of Resolution No. 194 of 2012 and Resolution No. 356 of 2017 will remain the same.
