RESOLUTION NO. 240 OF 2022

RESOLUTION INTRODUCED BY SUPERVISORS CONOVER, HOGAN, DICKINSON, THOMAS, BRUNO, MERLINO AND STROUGH

RESCINDING RESOLUTION NOS. 496 OF 2003, 601 OF 2008 AND 269 OF 2018, WHICH AUTHORIZED THE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC WORKS TO EXECUTE CHANGE ORDERS FOR HIGHWAY, BRIDGE AND BUILDING PROJECTS WITHOUT COMMITTEE APPROVAL

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 496 of 2003, the Warren County Board of Supervisors authorized the Superintendent of Public Works to execute change orders for Department of Public Works highway, bridge and building projects, with costs not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) per change order, for a total amount not to exceed Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) for each project contract, without Committee review and approval, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 601 of 2008, the Superintendent of Public Works was authorized to approve change orders in the amount of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) per change order for a total amount not to exceed Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) for a project and once approved by the Public Works Committee without objection, then the Superintendent shall be authorized to approve additional change orders in the amount of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) per change order, not to exceed a new aggregate amount of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) for each project, with the authorization and procedure to continue in the same manner for each subsequent round of change orders until the project is completed, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 269 of 2018, the Superintendent of Public Works was authorized to approve and execute change orders in an amount not to exceed Thirty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000) per change order for an aggregate amount of Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000) for each project, and

WHEREAS, the Public Works Committee has approved a request to authorize the Superintendent of Public Works to approve and execute change orders for construction contracts up to individual and aggregate amounts, with such authority being made by separate resolution, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Warren County Board of Supervisors hereby rescinds Resolution Nos. 496 of 2003, 601 of 2008 and 269 of 2018.
