Proclamation

WHEREAS, Breast Cancer Awareness Month is a time for standing with those courageous women who have been diagnosed with breast cancer, and for honoring those who have lost their battle to this insidious disease, and

WHEREAS, as the second most common cancer affecting women, more than 300,000 new cases of breast cancer are expected to be diagnosed in 2025, which means that approximately 1 in 8 women will be afflicted, and

WHEREAS, nearly 43,000 women die from breast cancer each year in the United States, a number that could be reduced with increased breast cancer screenings and outreach, and

WHEREAS, increased breast cancer screening increases early detection; reduces death; increases life expectancy; decreases late-stage cancer diagnoses; and increases five-year survival rates, and

WHEREAS, 2025 marks the 34th anniversary of the National Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program which provides free breast and cervical cancer screenings to low-income, uninsured, and underinsured women, and


