RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC WORKS TO ISSUE PERMITS FOR USE OF CERTAIN COUNTY FACILITIES

WHEREAS, pursuant to Local Law No. 2 of 1971, the Department of Public Works was established and provided for the powers and duties of the Superintendent of Public Works, and

WHEREAS, the Superintendent of Public Works was given the responsibility for the construction, maintenance, supervision and custodial care of all county owned facilities, including parks and recreational facilities, and

WHEREAS, requests are made from time to time by public organizations for permission to use County facilities, be it

RESOLVED, that the Superintendent of Public Works be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to issue Permits for the use of all County owned facilities including but not limited to recreational facilities, in the form approved by the County Attorney.

Such permits shall provide for the furnishing of certificates of insurance by the permittee protecting the County against any and all claims for property damages and personal injuries as a result of the use of the facility by the permittee and in such amounts as may be approved by the County Attorney.
