RESOLUTION INTRODUCED BY SUPERVISORS BRUNO, CONOVER, PATCHETT, DIAMOND, STROUGH, BEATY AND NILES

AUTHORIZING AN INTERMUNICIPAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN WARREN COUNTY AND THE CITY OF GLENS FALLS FOR THE TRANSFER OF FIRE PREVENTION & BUILDING CODE ENFORCEMENT RESPONSIBILITIES TO WARREN COUNTY

WHEREAS, the City of Glens Falls (“City”) presently maintains a Building & Code Department that is responsible for administration and enforcement of the New York State Uniform Fire Prevention and Building Code and the State Energy Construction Code (the “Uniform Code”) within the jurisdictional boundaries of the City, and

WHEREAS, the County likewise maintains a Fire Prevention & Building Code Enforcement Department that administers and enforces the Uniform Code throughout Warren County and for each municipality located within the County, except for the City and the Town of Queensbury, and

WHEREAS, the County and City desire, pursuant to Section 381 of the New York Executive Law, to transfer from the City to the County the governmental function related to the administration and enforcement of the Uniform Code within the City, in order to increase efficiencies and protect public health, safety and welfare, and

WHEREAS, the County and City are to enter into an intermunicipal shared services agreement for a period of five (5) years, for an amount based off the actual cost incurred by the County minus revenues collected, and the transfer of up to three (3) employees from the City to the County, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Warren County Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Chair of the Board of Supervisors to execute an intermunicipal agreement with the City of Glens Falls for the transfer of fire prevention & building code enforcement functions as described in the preambles of this resolution, in a form approved by the County Attorney.
