— life in reality is only tomorrow going forward.

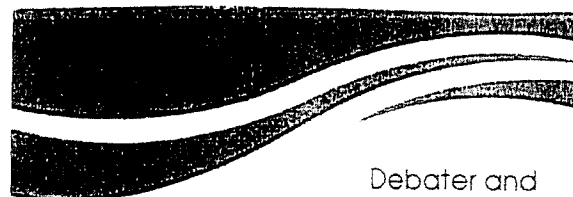
Everybody makes mistakes learning.

Youth cabinet created in Glens Falls

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GLENS FALLS – “The times, they are a-changin’,” prophesied Bob Dylan in his 1964 youth anthem.

In 2027, the times might be changing at Glens Falls City Hall, too.

The city’s Common Council approved the creation of a youth cabinet on Tuesday. The idea was proposed by Glens Falls High School students who formulated their proposal in a public policy class led by their teacher, Rachelle Stewart.

The cabinet, set to launch next year, will share its members’ ideas directly with the mayor and council, granting high schoolers the opportunity to speak on behalf of local youth. The cabinet will also be tasked with spearheading projects designed to benefit the community.

“We look forward to working out when this starts and hearing who the students selected are,” said Mayor Diana Palmer

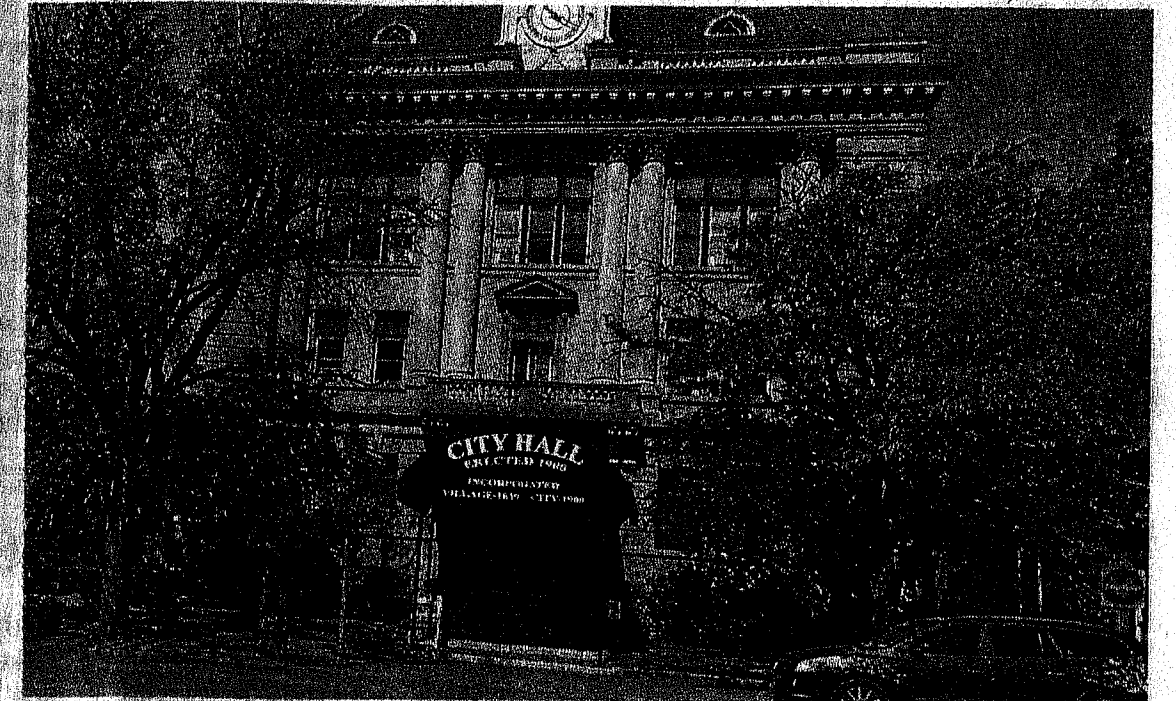
after the proposal was quickly approved by the council.

Every year, the cabinet will organize one council-approved project. Potential project ideas presented at the council meeting on Tuesday included revamping local parks (such as Crandall Park or Haviland’s Cove), hosting youth job fairs, orchestrating mental health awareness campaigns, and organizing park clean-up days.

How the youth cabinet will work

The cabinet will consist of seven members ages 14-18, with each ward/elementary school in the city being represented by at least one member. Students in the Glens Falls school district who don’t reside within city limits can participate as non-voting members.

Among the members will be a president, who is charged with facilitating meetings,

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setting meeting agendas, and serving as a primary point of contact between the cabinet and the mayor. A vice president will assist the president in these tasks and

manage subcommittees.

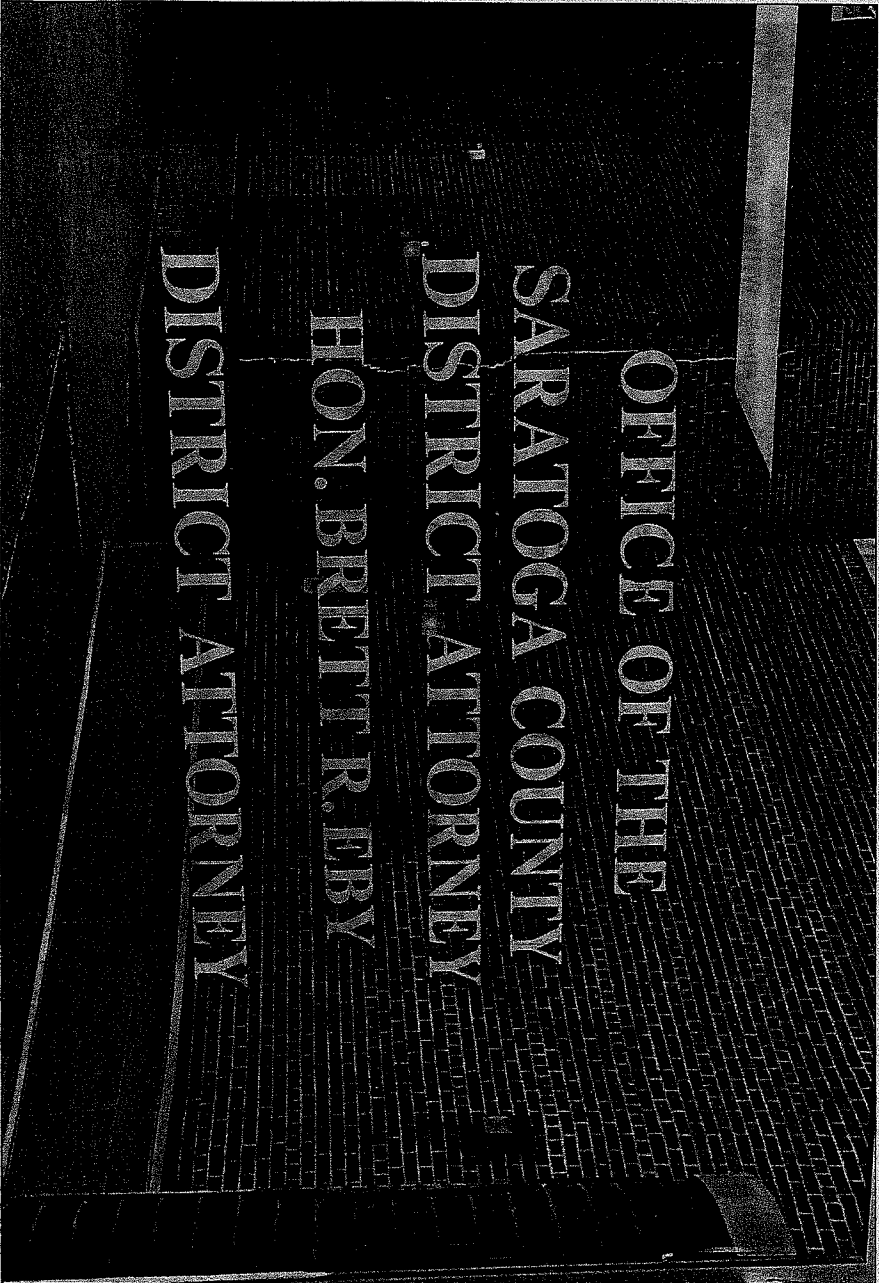
Monthly meetings will occur at the high school and subcommittees will meet remotely. Cabinet members will serve one-year terms and will be limited to two consecutive terms. Votes will be decided by a simple majority.

The cabinet hopes to partner with local organizations such as the Crandall Public Library, the Glens Falls YMCA, and Glens Falls Parks and Recreation, among others.

District attorney announces 53-member Child Safety Review Commission

SARATOGA COUNTY, N.Y. » Saratoga County District Attorney Brett Eby recently announced the formation of the Saratoga County Child Safety Review Commission.

Eby said the review commission is "a multidisciplinary effort bringing together 53 professionals and community leaders committed to identifying gaps in the systems designed to protect children and developing solutions to address them."

According to the DA's office, the believed-to-be first-of-its-kind commission was formed following "an overwhelming response from the community" with more than 250 individuals expressing interest in serving.

The 53-member commission is made up of Eby, representatives from law enforcement, child advocacy, education, public policy, social services, mental health,

health care, the faith community, local government, the judiciary, the State Legislature, philanthropic communities and many other groups and organizations.

"This commission is about bringing smart, dedicated professionals who care deeply about children into one room and giving them the opportunity to work together on some of the most difficult challenges facing our children," Eby said in a press release. "We received more than 250 letters of interest from people who wanted to be part of this effort. That response demonstrates just how deeply our community cares about public safety and the well-being of its children."

The district attorney's office said that the goal of the Child Safety Review Commission is to identify gaps in the systems intended to pro-

tect children, understand why those gaps exist and develop practical solutions to close them. The hope is that the commission's membership reflects the many systems and disciplines that intersect with child safety, with every member serving in a volunteer capacity, Eby noted.

"This is not about pointing fingers or assigning blame," Eby also stated. "It is about taking an honest look at our systems, asking difficult questions, and finding ways to make them better. We are trying to prevent future tragedies, and I am confident that bringing this group of talented and compassionate professionals together will help us develop meaningful answers to the problems facing our children."

Members include law enforcement officers and investigators, school administrators, counselors and nurses, child protective services and social services professionals, mental health clinicians, child advocates, public policy experts, health care professionals, government and county leaders, elected officials, a retired Family Court judge, a pastor, nonprofit executives, and community leaders.

"Child safety does not fall within the responsi-
